

AT THE HEART OF PGE2/MSc1

Specialization

A specialization to acquire professional skills

- Specialization prepares for professional experience and, optionaly, a Gap Year
 - If you go to Partner University during S4, choose carefully classes you will take there, in order to prepare your PGE3/MSc2.
 - An approved learning agreement is mandatory for academic semester abroad.
- Specialization change between PGE2 and PGE3
 - Expect additional preparation before entering PGE3 (exam may be required)
 - Expect additional modules in PGE3/MSc2 (Spring semester) if you want to graduate from the MSc
 - Accessing to apprenticeship in PGE3 is restricted: you need to have a <u>contract</u>, and admin. Approval.
- No change in case of MSc only

PGE2/MSc1 CHOICES

November:

Elective & specialization modules in S4 / Spring semester

January:

- 1st session for Partner University selection,
- Apply for an academic semester during a Gap Year or PGE3/MSc2

March / April:

- PGE: Are you willing to take a Gap Year?
- PGE: Project for PGE3/M2? Double degree?
- Teaching language (if applicable)



END OF PGE2/MSc1 What to do during summer?

- A short professional experience
 - A must, if not already done during PGE1
 - A must, if you need that short experience to validate the PGE professional quitus (9 months of prof. exp.)
 - May be extended, in case of a gap year
- Prepare some future academic semester abroad
 - Cultural immersion
 - Language practice
- 10 weeks minimum (3 months is better!)




INTERNSHIPS IN PGE2/MSc1

PGE2/MSc1 prof. experience (minimum 10 weeks) is important to:

- Validate a short experience (if not done before)
- Contribute to the required minimum of 9 months of prof. Exp (quitus PGE)

Some rules:

- Avoid a very short experience
- Do not change ending dates!



Limit: Aug. 31st



THE PGE GAP YEAR

What you should know about the G/Y

It's optional:

- You must apply during PGE2 (around March)
- Credits earned in G/Y cannot be taken into account for the master degree

It's not possible, if:

- You have a "contrat d'apprentissage"
- You are not registered in the PGE (ie MSc only)

• Its content is up to you, with some limits:

- You can mix academic, professional, personal experiences.
- Internships are strongly regulated by the French Law:
 - But: this only applies for internship agreements. Any other form of contract is not subject to these constraints.



BLENDED LEARNING (Delivery modes)

Class-contact / distance learning / student work

- Class-contact time / Le temps présentiel (PR) :
 - Usual, in class, whenever the situation permits (shall replace a DS).
- Distance learning time / Le temps distanciel :
 - Synchronous (DS): video-conference
 - Asynchronous (DA): based on resources on MyICN (videos, readings, ...)
- Student work / Le temps du travail personnel (TE) :
 - Sometimes included as a session, but more often, to be achieved in addition to sessions.
 - For preliminary & further readings, exercises, projects, ...



PROJECT MODE (Types of times)

30 h = 21 h « course » + 9h « project »

The course :

- Lecture / cours classique (CM)
- Directed work / travaux dirigés (TD)

The project :

- Student work / Travail étudiant (TE) : with a precise time slot, or at your convenience.
- Scheduled assistance / Accompagnement planifié (AP) : with a precise time slot, with your instructor (project work + support from your instructor).
- Unscheduled assistance / Accompagnement non planifié (AN): without a precise time slot, with your instructor (forum, office hours, rendez-vous, ... to solve various problems).
