Bloomberg Market Concepts Program (BMC)

ICN Library currently provides students access to the Bloomberg Market Concepts program at ICN Business School. **Bloomberg Market Concepts program** is designed to provide users with an introduction to Bloomberg Professional Service. BMC training uses a series of Training Pages to introduce users to basic Bloomberg functionality with the Core Program and a supplementary Market Sector Program to help users become familiar with finding data and market information using Bloomberg.



Create a New Login

Instructions to create your Personal Login for Bloomberg Market Concepts (BMC):

- 1. Double click the Bloomberg icon on the desktop of the machine to launch Bloomberg.
- 2. Once Bloomberg is open, click on <Enter/GO> to bring up the log-in screen.
- 3. Select the **Create New Login** option below the Login Name and Password boxes.



- 4. Follow the instructions on each screen to fill in your personal information, including your ICN email address and your cell phone number in order to receive your validation code.
- 5. Once Bloomberg has sent you a validation code, via SMS text, automated phone call or email, enter it in the appropriate field and press Continue.
- 6. Create your personal Password and then "Click here to return to the login screen".

Individual Login Name

You must create your own Bloomberg Market Concepts User Login and Password. To do so from the Bloomberg terminal, enter BMC into the amber field on the start screen, then click on <a>GO> and Create a new login on the front page. You will need to either receive an email or an automated call during this process to validate your user name and password, so please have a cell phone with you or open your email in the browser to retrieve the code from the auto-generated email that will be sent when creating the account.



Overview

Bloomberg Market Concepts (BMC) is an 8-hour self-paced e-learning course that provides an introduction to the financial markets. BMC consists of 4 modules – **Economic Indicators, Currencies, Fixed Income and Equities** – woven together from Bloomberg data, news and analytics. BMC is no additional charge on the Terminal inside the school. It is available on the web for a fee at www.bloomberginstitute.com.


Exams

As you work through the modules, there are mini quizzes after each section. Each module has a video component and a navigation panel on the right with a progress indicator (orange circle) that displays how much of the program you have completed when you hover over the progress circle.

Frequently Asked Questions

Can I pause a module and resume it at a later date?

Yes. When you log back into the module, it will reopen where you left off.

Can I just do one module?

Yes. However, to earn the certificate of completion you must complete all modules.

When do I get the certificate?

When you log in at BMC<GO>, your certificate will be downloadable from the course home page as soon as you have completed all four modules.

Do I need a calculator to complete the course?

Yes. A basic calculator is sufficient.

Is there a pass/fail mark learners need to achieve in order to obtain a certificate?

No. It is a certificate of completion.

Is my score private?

Yes. Per our Privacy Policy, your personal information and score are private.

Are group or class score reports available?

Yes. They are available for professors or employers who sponsor a cohort of learners. Only those learners who explicitly consent will have their scores included in the report.
